CHARGING POLICY

Background to the policy:

Churchill Community College aims to provide a broad, balanced curriculum for all students within its care. However, it is recognised that many educationally valuable activities have been, and will continue to be, dependent on financial contributions in whole or part from parents.

This policy applies to: All Students

This policy came into effect on: 1st March 2004

Last Reviewed - October 2016

Statement of the Policy:

The Governors have agreed that students should receive a "free education", but for educational visits, including the provision of transport, the College may request "voluntary contributions" towards the cost. No student will be disadvantaged through parents who are unable or unwilling to contribute.

Extra curricular activities beyond the normal school day may be chargeable as they can be opted into on a voluntary basis.

The College would always consider students in exceptional circumstances and consideration will be given to them on a case by case basis subject to the funds available at the College.
