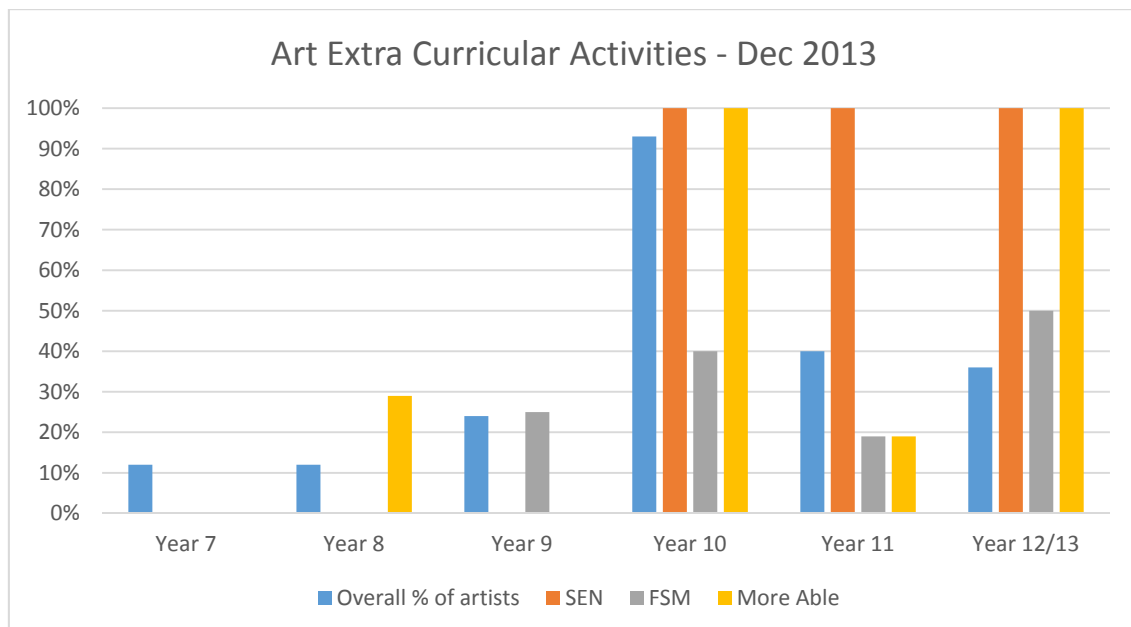


## STUDENT INVOLVEMENT IN EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Examples from the Art, PE and Music departments September - December 2013

### ART

- Year 7: 11% of girls in year 7 participated in a lunchtime or after school activity in art.
- Year 8: 12% of girls in year 8 participated in extra curricular art activities. 29% of these were more able students.
- Year 9: 24% of yr. 9 art students attended extra curricular activities. 25 % of which were FSM and 75% Pupil Premium students
- Year 10: 93% of yr. 10 artists attended an extra curricular activity. 100% attended one or more art trips. Of these 40% were FSM and 100% of statemented students in the cohort participated.
- Year 11: 40% of yr. 11 art students regularly attend extra curricular sessions of which 19% are more able students and 19% are FSM.
- Year 12/13: 36% of sixth form art students attend extra curricular sessions of which 50% of these are FSM



## PE AND SCHOOL SPORT

Students can take part in extracurricular activities before and after school and have the chance to take part in 'Active lunch' as well.

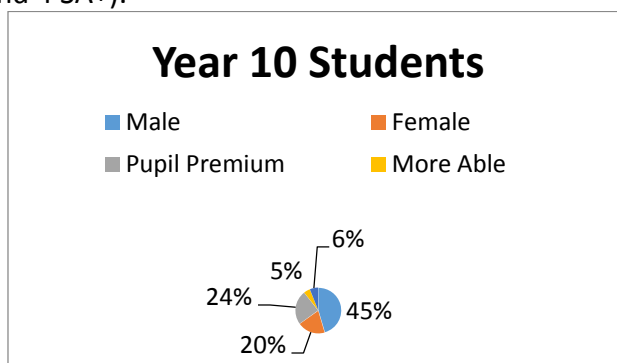
- 54% of students across the college have participated in extra-curricular activity outside of lesson time
- The uptake of PE and School Sport is:
  - 88% in Year 7
  - 73% in Year 8
  - 57% in Year 9
- Pupil premium and FSM students regularly access PE and School Sport with 55% attending extra-curricular practices
- 50% students who are SEND attend extra curricular activities and that figure is 86% for Year 7.
- 50% EAL students are involved in extra curricular sport.
- 93% of more able students participate in extra curricular sport, with 75% in Year 11
- 43% LAC students are involved in extracurricular sport.

## ICT, COMPUTING AND BUSINESS DEPARTMENT

**Year 7** – 1 student participated in an afterschool computing club – M, FSM

**Year 9** – 1.75% of total year group) 100% M - 50% is More Able, 50%, Pupil Premium.

**Year 10** – 18% of year group attended extracurricular activities in the department. Male - 67%, Female 33%, 46% pupil premium, 8% more able, 4% EAL student, 25% SEN status (6 students - 1 S, 1 SA, and 4 SA+).



**Year 11** – 40% of the year group attended extracurricular activities in the department. 45% Female and 55% Male. 24% Pupil Premium, 2% LAC, 4% SEN (2% SA, 2% SA+), 12% More Able students.

**Year 13** – 100% of ICT/Business students attended extracurricular. 30% Female, 70% Male. 38% Pupil Premium, 7% More Able, 5% EAL, 10% SEN status (3% S, 3% SA, 4% SA+).

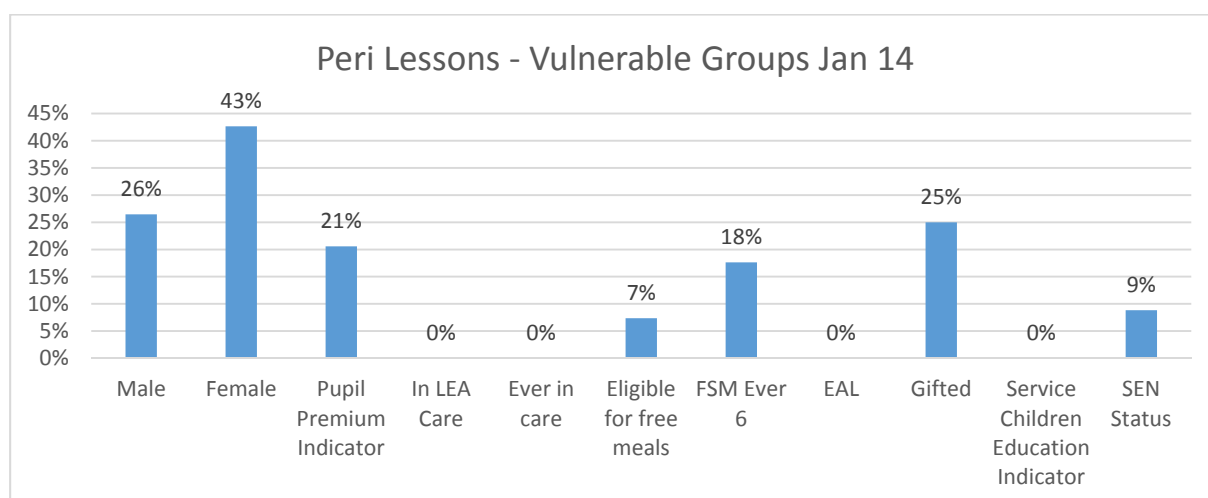
## MUSIC / PERFORMING ARTS

The music department is committed to ensuring that an opportunity to engage in music is available to all students in Churchill Community College. At present there are a wide range of peripatetic instrument lessons available, lunch time drop in sessions, extra-curricular clubs and college concerts/productions.

So far, 68 students have taken part in peripatetic instrument lessons or contributed to a school performance in the first term of this academic year.

47 students take peripatetic instrument lessons (drums, guitar, singing, trumpet, violin, keyboard) including:

- 20% Pupil Premium
- 25% who are/have been eligible for FSM
- 25% who are more able
- 10% who have SEN.
- 30% boys
- 70% girls



39 students contributed to our Christmas Concert and visits to local care homes including:

- 22% Pupil Premium
- 37% who are/have been eligible for FSM
- 22% who are part of our 'Gifted' programme
- 9% who have an SEN.
